

## **Missouri Crop Progress and Condition Report** (11/06/17)

Cool temperatures and little precipitation in the week allowed harvest to progress. Statewide, the temperature averaged 48.0 degrees, 2.7 degrees below normal. Precipitation averaged 0.26 inches statewide, 0.92 inches below normal. There were 5.2 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending November 5. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 5 percent very short, 17 percent short, 72 percent adequate, and 6 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 6 percent very short, 19 percent short, 73 percent adequate, and 2 percent surplus. Corn harvested for grain was 87 percent complete, compared to 92 percent for the 5-year average. Soybean harvest was 77 percent complete, up 14 percentage points from last week. Cotton harvest was 89 percent complete, compared to 73 percent for the 5-yer average. Sorghum harvest was 85 percent complete. Winter wheat planted reached 69 percent, compared to 75 percent for the 5-year average. Winter wheat emerged reached 47 percent. Winter wheat condition was rated 5 percent poor, 31 percent fair, 57 percent good, and 7 percent excellent. Pasture and range condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 10 percent poor, 43 percent fair, 41 percent good, and 4 percent excellent.
