

MISSOURI CROP PROGRESS REPORT 06/24/19

Temperatures last week averaged 72.4 degrees, 2.0 degrees below normal. Precipitation averaged 3.00 inches statewide, 1.97 inches above normal. There was 2.1 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending June 23, 2019. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 49 percent adequate, and 51 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 63 percent adequate, and 37 percent surplus. Corn planted progressed to 92 percent this week, while corn emerged progressed to 85 percent. Corn condition was rated at 8 percent very poor, 25 percent poor, 39 percent fair, 26 percent good, and 2 percent excellent. Soybeans planted progressed to 66 percent, 31 percentage points behind last year, while soybeans emerged progressed to 51 percent. Soybean condition was rated at 4 percent very poor, 11 percent poor, 49 percent fair, 34 percent good, and 2 percent excellent. Cotton planted progressed to 89 percent, while cotton squaring progressed to 10 percent. Cotton condition was rated at 7 percent very poor, 8 percent poor, 55 percent fair, and 30 percent good. Rice planted progressed to 95 percent, while rice emerged progressed to 92 percent. Rice condition was rated at 3 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 44 percent fair, 31 percent good, and 16 percent excellent. Winter wheat harvested progressed to 18 percent, 45 percentage points behind last year. Winter wheat condition was rated at 5 percent very poor, 17 percent poor, 45 percent fair, 31 percent good, and 2 percent excellent. Alfalfa first cutting progressed to 82 percent, 12 percentage points behind last year. Alfalfa second cutting progressed to 4 percent, 30 percentage points behind last year. Other Hay first cutting progressed to 45 percent, 30 percentage points behind last year.
