

MISSOURI CROP PROGRESS REPORT 09/03/19

Temperatures last week averaged 71.5 degrees, 3.9 degrees below normal. Precipitation averaged 2.19 inches statewide, 1.31 inches above normal. There were 3.7 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending September 1, 2019. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent very short, 8 percent short, 77 percent adequate, and 14 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent very short, 5 percent short, 87 percent adequate, and 7 percent surplus. Corn dough progressed to 89 percent. Corn dented progressed to 61 percent, while corn matured progressed to 6 percent, 40 percentage points behind last year. Corn condition was rated at 4 percent very poor, 18 percent poor, 40 percent fair, 33 percent good, and 5 percent excellent. Soybeans blooming progressed to 93 percent this week, while soybeans setting pods progressed to 74 percent, 18 percentage points behind last year. Soybean condition was rated at 3 percent very poor, 11 percent poor, 40 percent fair, 40 percent good, and 6 percent excellent. Cotton bolls opening progressed to 20 percent, 31 percentage points behind last year. Cotton condition was rated at 9 percent very poor, 14 percent poor, 51 percent fair, and 26 percent good. Rice headed progressed to 96 percent this week. Rice condition was rated at 3 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 37 percent fair, 38 percent good, and 16 percent excellent. Alfalfa third cutting progressed to 80 percent.
