

MISSOURI CROP PROGRESS REPORT 09/16/19

Temperatures last week averaged 77.4 degrees, 7.5 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 0.21 inches statewide, 0.81 inches below normal. There were 6.0 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending September 15, 2019. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 2 percent very short, 19 percent short, 75 percent adequate, and 4 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent very short, 11 percent short, 84 percent adequate, and 4 percent surplus. Corn dented progressed to 80 percent, while corn matured progressed to 30 percent, 49 percentage points behind last year. Corn harvested for grain progressed to 8 percent. Corn condition was rated at 3 percent very poor, 16 percent poor, 38 percent fair, 38 percent good, and 5 percent excellent. Soybeans setting pods progressed to 90 percent, 5 percentage points behind last year. Soybean coloring progressed to 15 percent this week, with soybeans dropping leaves progressing to 2 percent. Soybean condition was rated at 3 percent very poor, 9 percent poor, 34 percent fair, 48 percent good, and 6 percent excellent. Cotton bolls opening progressed to 48 percent, 32 percentage points behind last year. Cotton condition was rated at 7 percent very poor, 10 percent poor, 52 percent fair, and 31 percent good. Rice harvested progressed to 22 percent this week, 3 percentage points ahead of last year. Rice condition was rated at 3 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 38 percent fair, 40 percent good, and 13 percent excellent. Alfalfa third cutting progressed to 93 percent.
