Missouri Crop Progress and Condition 4/27/20

Temperatures last week averaged 56.4 degrees, 1.8 degrees below normal. Precipitation averaged 1.97 inches statewide, 0.95 inches above normal. There were 3.6 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending April 26, 2020. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent short, 72 percent adequate, and 27 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent short, 76 percent adequate and 23 percent surplus. Corn planted progressed to 25 percent this week, advancing 14 percentage points ahead of last week. Corn emerged progressed to 5 percent, 8 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Soybeans planted progressed to 2 percent, 1 percentage point ahead of last year. Rice planted progressed to 22 percent, 8 percentage points behind last year, while rice emerged progressed to 2 percent. Winter wheat headed progressed to 20 percent this week, 12 percentage points ahead of last year. Winter wheat condition was rated at 2 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 39 percent fair, 48 percent good, and 5 percent excellent.
