

Missouri Crop Progress and Condition 5/04/20 Temperatures last week averaged 61.3 degrees, 2.8 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 0.81 inches statewide, 0.37 inches below normal. There were 3.9 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending May 3, 2020. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 81 percent adequate and 19 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent short, 82 percent adequate and 17 percent surplus. Corn planted progressed to 44 percent this week, advancing 19 percentage points ahead of last week. Corn emerged progressed to 14 percent, 17 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Soybeans planted progressed to 7 percent, 4 percentage points ahead of last year. Rice planted progressed to 37 percent, 7 percentage points behind last year, while rice emerged progressed to 20 percent. Winter wheat headed progressed to 42 percent this week, 20 percentage points ahead of last year. Winter wheat condition was rated at 2 percent very poor, 5 percent poor, 41 percent fair, 48 percent good, and 4 percent excellent.
