

Missouri Crop Progress and Condition 05/11/20

Temperatures last week averaged 54.5 degrees, 7.3 degrees below normal. Precipitation averaged 1.42 inches statewide, 0.45 inches above normal. There were 3.1 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending May 10, 2020. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent short, 80 percent adequate, and 19 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated was rated 1 percent short, 83 percent adequate and 16 percent surplus. Corn planted progressed to 67 percent this week, 11 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Corn emerged progressed to 33 percent, 18 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Soybeans planted progressed to 14 percent, 10 percentage points ahead of last year, while soybean emerged progressed to 4 percent. Cotton planted progressed to 10 percent this week, 11 percentage points behind last year. Rice planted progressed to 51 percent, 1 percentage point behind last year, while rice emerged progressed to 31 percent. Winter wheat headed progressed to 59 percent this week, 15 percentage points ahead of last year. Winter wheat condition was rated at 2 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 41 percent fair, 47 percent good, and 4 percent excellent.
