

Missouri Crop Progress and Condition 06/15/20

Temperatures last week averaged 73.7 degrees, 1.5 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 1.16 inches statewide, 0.20 inches above normal. There were 5.1 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending June 14, 2020. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 4 percent short, 86 percent adequate, and 10 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent short, 84 percent adequate and 15 percent surplus. Corn emerged progressed to 94 percent, 1 percentage point ahead the 5-year average. Corn condition was rated at 1 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 30 percent fair, 52 percent good, and 11 percent excellent. Soybeans planted progressed to 78 percent, 27 percentage points ahead of last year, while soybeans emerged progressed to 59 percent. Soybeans condition was rated at 1 percent very poor, 5 percent poor, 36 percent fair, 53 percent good, and 5 percent excellent. Cotton planted progressed to 82 percent this week, 2 percentage points behind last year. Cotton condition was rated at 19 percent very poor, 19 percent poor, 37 percent fair, and 25 percent good. Rice planted progressed to 95 percent, 5 percentage points ahead of last year, while rice emerged progressed to 87 percent. Rice condition was rated at 1 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 38 percent fair, 40 percent good, and 14 percent excellent. Winter wheat harvested for grain progressed to 14 percent this week, 6 percentage point ahead of last year and 7 percentage points behind the 5-year average.
