Temperatures last week averaged 74.7 degrees, 0.7 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 0.55 inches statewide, 0.44 inches below normal. There were 5.8 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending June 21, 2020. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent very short, 12 percent short, 79 percent adequate, and 8 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 5 percent short, 87 percent adequate and 8 percent surplus. Corn emerged progressed to 96 percent, 1 percentage point ahead the 5-year average. Corn silking was at 4 percent this week. Corn condition was rated at 1 percent very poor, 5 percent poor, 24 percent fair, 58 percent good, and 12 percent excellent. Soybeans planted progressed to 89 percent, 26 percentage points ahead of last year, while soybeans emerged progressed to 74 percent. Soybeans condition was rated at 1 percent very poor, 4 percent poor, 32 percent fair, 57 percent good, and 6 percent excellent. Cotton planted progressed to 90 percent this week, 2 percentage points ahead last year. Cotton squaring progressed to 4 percent, 5 percentage points behind last year. Cotton condition was rated at 15 percent very poor, 15 percent poor, 39 percent fair, and 31 percent good. Rice emerged progressed to 97 percent. Rice condition was rated at 1 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 38 percent fair, 35 percent good, and 19 percent excellent. Winter wheat harvested for grain progressed to 41 percent this week, 25 percentage points ahead of last year. Winter wheat condition was rated at 1 percent year poor, 45 percent appeared to 41 percent this week, 25 percentage points ahead of last year.
