

Temperatures last week averaged 75.0 degrees, 0.4 degrees below normal. Precipitation averaged 0.62 inches statewide, 0.38 inches below normal. There were 5.8 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending June 28, 2020. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent very short, 22 percent short, 71 percent adequate, and 6 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent very short, 12 percent short, 79 percent adequate and 8 percent surplus. Corn silking was at 7 percent this week, 3 percentage points ahead of last year. Corn condition was rated at 1 percent very poor, 5 percent poor, 26 percent fair, 56 percent good, and 12 percent excellent.
