

Missouri Crop Progress and Condition 08/03/20

Temperatures last week averaged 76.0 degrees, 0.7 degree below normal. Precipitation averaged 3.04 inches statewide, 2.29 inches above normal. There were 3.5 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending August 2, 2020. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 2 percent very short, 9 percent short, 78 percent adequate, and 11 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 3 percent very short, 10 percent short, 82 percent adequate and 5 percent surplus. Corn silking was 95 percent this week, 11 percentage points ahead of last year. Corn dough progressed to 54 percent, 4 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Corn dented was 4 percent this week. Corn condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 4 percent poor, 20 percent fair, 57 percent good, and 17 percent excellent. Soybeans blooming progressed to 73 percent, 26 percentage points ahead of last year. Soybean setting pods progressed to 37 percent, 23 percentage points ahead of last year. Soybeans condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 5 percent poor, 22 percent fair, 56 percent good, and 16 percent excellent. Cotton squaring progressed to 69 percent, 17 percentage points behind last year. Cotton setting bolls progressed to 28 percent, 14 percentage points behind last year. Cotton condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 10 percent poor, 40 percent fair, 47 percent good and 1 percent excellent. Rice headed progressed to 34 percent, 4 percentage points ahead of last vear. Rice condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 29 percent fair, 42 percent good, and 22 percent excellent.

Several barns saw pretty large runs, especially for the first week in August when heat and humidity typically prevent a lot of cattle movement. This past week has been nothing like a normal August however, as cool temperatures had many looking for or thinking about jackets a few mornings. Along with the below normal temperatures, the addition of recent moisture has provided a great boost to pastures and moods, as some were very close to the possibility of having to start feeding a little. As of Thursday's close boxed beef cut outs are higher for the week, choice closed at 204.66 up 1.40 and select at 192.01 up 2.12 compared to last Friday's close. Feedlot sales early in the week were higher and climbed as the week went on making for some pretty wide spreads this week. Live sales were reported from 99.00-105.00 mostly 100.00-103.00 and dressed sales from 162.00-169.00 mostly around 163.00. Friday's Missouri Stocker Formula consisted of 5228 head with a weighted average weight of 552.74 lbs. and a price value of 157.47, 2.82 higher than last Friday. Supply included: 78% Feeder Cattle (57% Steers, 0% Dairy Steers, 39% Heifers, 4% Bulls); 10% Slaughter Cattle (1% Steers, 0% Dairy Steers, 2% Heifers, 82% Cows, 15% Bulls); 12% Replacement Cattle (6% Stock Cows, 68% Bred Cows, 9% Bred Heifers, 16% Cow-Calf Pairs, 1% Heifer Pairs, 0% Bulls).
