Missouri Crop Progress and Condition 08/10/20
Temperatures last week averaged 71.6 degrees, 4.4 degree below normal. Precipitation averaged 0.82 inches statewide, equal to the average. There were 5.2 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending August 9, 2020. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 2 percent very short, 8 percent short, 80 percent adequate, and 10 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 2 percent very short, 9 percent short, 84 percent adequate and 5 percent surplus. Corn dough progressed to 72 percent, 18 percentage points ahead of last year. Corn dented was 25 percent this week. Corn condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 4 percent poor, 19 percent fair, 57 percent good, and 18 percent excellent. Soybeans blooming progressed to 83 percent, 18 percentage points ahead of last year. Soybean setting pods progressed to 56 percent, 24 percentage points ahead of last year. Soybeans condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 5 percent poor, 20 percent fair, 58 percent good, and 16 percent excellent. Cotton squaring progressed to 77 percent, 15 percentage points behind last year. Cotton setting bolls progressed to 44 percent, 9 percentage points behind last year. Cotton condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 13 percent poor, 36 percent fair, and 49 percent good. Rice headed progressed to 54 percent, 4 percentage points ahead of last year. Rice condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 30 percent fair, 47 percent good, and 16 percent excellent.

Compared to last week feeder steers and heifers sold uneven from 3.00 lower to 3.00 higher. Mid-weight feeders from 550-700 lbs. found the most strength and were mostly higher across the state while feather weights and a lighter supply of heavy weights were mostly lower. The supply of feeders was much lighter this week, a combination of heat and spots of heavy rains around the state. Pastures and water conditions around the state are looking very good for mid-August and most producers are very happy about the amount of green they are seeing on their farms. The exception would be some areas in the south west which are still considered abnormally dry. Fed cattle trade continued the climb higher marking six weeks of higher prices. As of this report live sales have been reported from 102.00-107.40 and dressed sales 165.00- 170.00. Boxed beef cutouts are also higher again this week, as of Thursday's close choice was reported at 210.95 up 5.48 and select at 195.41 up 2.66 compared to last Friday's close. Friday's Missouri Stocker Formula consisted of 3229 head with a weighted average weight of 559.17 lbs. and a price value of 157.30, 0.17 lower than last Friday. Supply included: 79% Feeder Cattle (52% Steers, 1% Dairy Steers, 42% Heifers, 6% Bulls); 10% Slaughter Cattle (2% Steers, 2% Heifers, 82% Cows, 14% Bulls); 10% Replacement Cattle (7% Stock Cows, 69% Bred Cows, 1% Bred Heifers, 21% Cow-Calf Pairs, 2% Bulls). Feeder cattle supply over 600 lbs was 57%.
