

Precipitation averaged 0.79 inches statewide, 0.01 inches below normal. There were 6.2 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending October 4, 2020. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 4 percent very short, 23 percent short and 73 percent adequate. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 4 percent very short, 21 percent short and 75 percent adequate. Corn mature progressed to 81 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 93 percent. Corn harvested for grain was 31 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average. of 95 percent. Corn narvested for grain was 31 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 56 percent. Corn condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 4 percent poor, 15 percent fair, 63 percent good, and 17 percent excellent. Soybeans turning color was 84 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 83 percent. Soybeans dropping leaves was 49 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 57 percent. Soybean harvest was 6 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 14 percent very poor, 3 percent poor, 19 Soybean condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 3 percent poor, 19 percent fair, 59 percent good, and 18 percent excellent. Receipts: 24,154 Week ago: 24,246 Year ago: 22,056 Compared to last week, steers sold unevenly steady to 3.00 lower, except for some loads of yearlings over 800 lbs. which sold steady to 2.00 higher. Feeder heifers were mixed from 3.00 lower to 1.00 higher. The supply of feeders was moderate and demand was moderate to good. Weather continues to weight on the markets early week several areas of the state seen the first frost of the year. Not a hard killing frost but all the same it was frost. By mid to late week temperatures were in the mid 80's. These swings are incredibly hard on the health of calves which make up the majority of the offering this time of year. It can't be stressed enough how much good vaccination and weaning programs pays especially in the fall. Higher grain prices this week also put pressure on the cattle market. Corn prices are as high as they have been for the past year and quite unusual that the yearly highs have come right in the height of harvest. Drought also is becoming quite concerning especially in the southwest corner of the state where a small area has moved in to D3 status now. Boxed beef cutouts were lower for the week. Choice closed on Thursday at 216.00 down 2.88 and select 203.10 down 4.51 compared to last Friday. Slaughter cattle sales have been slow to develop this week as feedlot managers have dug in and try to gain more ground as of Thursday afternoon just over 40k head reported for the week. A few early sales have been reported mostly at 107.00-108.00 a few at 110.00 live which is steady to 1.00 higher and 169.00- 170.00 dressed which is 1.00-2.00 higher. Friday's Missouri Stocker Formula consisted of 3933 head with a weighted average of 549.17 lbs. and a price value of 149.98 down 0.45 compared to last Friday. Supply included: 83% Feeder Cattle (56% Steers, 0% Dairy Steers, 38% Heifers, 5% Bulls, 0% Dairy Heifers); 13% Slaughter Cattle (2% Steers, 0% Heifers, 86% Cows, 11% Bulls); 4% Replacement Cattle (21% Stock Cows, 56% Bred Cows, 3% Bred Heifers, 21% Cow-Calf Pairs). Feeder cattle supply over 600 lbs was 58%.
