

#### Missouri Crop Progress and Condition 10/13/20

Temperatures last week averaged 65.2 degrees, 7.1 degrees above normal. The only measurable precipitation occurred in the Southeast part of the state. There were 6.5 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending October 11, 2020. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 11 percent very short, 35 percent short and 54 percent adequate. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 7 percent very short, 27 percent short and 66 percent adequate. Corn mature progressed to 94 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 97 percent. Corn harvested for grain was 51 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 66 percent. Corn condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 4 percent poor, 16 percent fair, 61 percent good, and 17 percent excellent. Soybeans turning color was 95 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 92 percent. Soybeans dropping leaves was 77 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 74 percent. Soybean harvest was 22 percent complete, compared to the 5- year average of 24 percent. Soybean condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 4 percent poor, 23 percent fair, 58 percent good, and 14 percent excellent. Cotton harvest was 19 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 34 percent. Cotton condition was rated 3 percent very poor, 11 percent poor, 41 percent fair, 44 percent good, and 1 percent excellent. Rice harvest was 75 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 85 percent. Winter wheat planted progressed to 26 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 24 percent. Winter wheat emerged was 7 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 10 percent.

# Missouri Weekly Cattle Auction Summary 10/16/20

Receipts: 22,291 Week ago: 24,154 Year ago: 28,875 Compared to last week, calves sold 3.00 to 5.00 lower and yearlings sold steady to 3.00 lower. The supply of feeders was moderate and demand continues to be very dependent upon health programs. The week ended with much cooler temperatures and a pretty heavy frost for most of the state on Friday morning. Moisture continues to avoid the state and drought areas are slowing intensifying each week. Reports of some hay feeding taking place and even some water concerns for some producers. The one up side to the dry weather would be for grain harvest. Corn harvest is slightly behind the 5 year average but over 50 percent complete according to the latest progress report. Bean harvest is about even with the 5 year average nearing 25 percent complete. These numbers are released early in the week however so progress and condition data is typically a week behind by the time this report is released. Boxed beef cutouts continue to decline, Thursday's close for choice was reported at 210.48, down 3.58 and select at 196.50 down 3.32 compared to last Friday. Feed lot sales lost ground this week ending the several week climb. Most sales should be done for the week as of Thursday afternoon just under 98k head have been reported. Live sales were reported mostly at 107.00-108.00 and dressed sales mostly 168.00-169.00 both steady to 1.00 lower. Friday's Missouri stocker formula consisted of 4,211 head with a weighted average weight of 546.26 lbs. and a price value of 147.56, 2.42 lower than last Friday. Supply included: 84% Feeder Cattle (52% Steers, 1% Dairy Steers, 40% Heifers, 6% Bulls); 11% Slaughter Cattle (1% Steers, 0% Heifers, 87% Cows, 12% Bulls); 4% Replacement Cattle (31% Stock Cows, 55% Bred Cows, 3% Bred Heifers, 11% Cow-Calf Pairs). Feeder cattle supply over 600 lbs was 51%.
