

#### Missouri Crop Progress and Condition 10/19/20

Temperatures last week averaged 56.1 degrees, 1.5 degrees below normal. Precipitation was limited to the Southeast half of the state with only a couple pockets of measurable rainfall in the Central and East Central areas. There were 6.4 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending October 18, 2020. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 13 percent very short, 41 percent short and 46 percent adequate. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 11 percent very short, 32 percent short and 57 percent adequate. Corn mature progressed to 98 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 99 percent. Corn harvested for grain was 64 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 74 percent. Soybean sdropping leaves was 92 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 86 percent. Soybean harvest was 40 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 36 percent. Soybean condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 5 percent poor, 23 percent fair, 54 percent good, and 17 percent excellent. Cotton harvest was 25 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 52 percent. Cotton condition was rated 3 percent very poor, 11 percent poor, 37 percent fair, and 49 percent good. Rice harvest was 81 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 37 percent. Winter wheat emerged was 18 percent, even with the 5year average

Compared to last week, steers sold 5.00 to 10.00 lower and heifers sold 3.00 to 7.00 lower. Supply was moderate with a good even span of light weight all the way to heavy weight cattle in the offering. Still many were calves just heavier weights. There was some yearlings but in reality, true long time yearlings are pretty short in supply this time of year. Demand was moderate for weaned and worked cattle and light for unweaned bawling calves that are having a hard time finding any one really wanting to take the risk of trying to straighten them out currently. The weather is just down right awful for trying to keep cattle healthy, which is always the case in October, and will remain that way until some stable cold weather sets in. Some moisture finally came to the state this week. Much too late for pasture growth but beneficial to winter wheat and stock water supplies. The monthly cattle on feed report will be published Friday afternoon prereport estimates have on feed numbers at 103.2, placements at 102.4, and marketings at 105.8. Boxed beef cutouts were lower again this week, choice closed Thursday at 208.86, down 1.17 and select 191.08, down 2.44 compared to last Friday. Feedlot sales saw most of this week's volume on Tuesday and Wednesday at much lower levels. Live sales were reported from 103.00-106.00 and dressed 162.00-165.00. Friday's Missouri Stocker Formula consisted of 3812 head with a weighted average weight of 548.03 lbs. and a price value of 141.35, down 6.21 from last Friday.
