

Missouri Crop Progress and Condition 11/30/20

Temperatures last week averaged 42.1 degrees, 2.7 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 1.05 inches statewide, 0.16 inches above average. There were 3.6 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending November 29, 2020. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 2 percent very short, 11 percent short, 85 percent adequate, and 2 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 3 percent very short, 19 percent short, and 78 percent adequate. Soybean harvest was 97 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 95 percent. Cotton harvest was 94 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 98 percent. Winter wheat planted progressed to 95 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 94 percent. Winter wheat emerged was 89 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 82 percent. Winter wheat condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 42 percent fair, 48 percent good, and 2 percent excellent.

Receipts: 51,165 Week ago: 21,613 Year ago: 47,077 Compared to last week, steers under 700 lbs. sold steady to 3.00 higher, over 700 lbs. weak to 4.00 lower and heifers sold unevenly steady from 2.00 lower to 2.00 higher. A very difficult week to nail down a price trend as many barns had to look back to two weeks for the last sale, and those that had sales last week were mostly special sales with a different type of offering than what was present this week. The supply of feeders was heavy, when all was said and done this week ended up being the second largest reported volume this calendar year.
