

CATTLE INVENTORY 01/29/21

January 1 Cattle Inventory down slightly

All cattle and calves in the United States as of January 1, 2021 totaled 93.6 million head, slightly below the 93.8 million head on January 1, 2020.

All cows and heifers that have calved, at 40.6 million head, were slightly below the 40.7 million head on January 1, 2020. Beef cows, at 31.2 million head, were down 1 percent from a year ago. Milk cows, at 9.44 million head, were up 1 percent from the previous year.

All heifers 500 pounds and over as of January 1, 2021 totaled 20.0 million head, slightly below the 20.0 million head on January 1, 2020. Beef replacement heifers, at 5.81 million head, were up slightly from a year ago. Milk replacement heifers, at 4.60 million head, were down 2 percent from the previous year. Other heifers, at 9.58 million head, were 1 percent above a year earlier.

Steers weighing 500 pounds and over as of January 1, 2021 totaled 16.6 million head, up slightly from January 1, 2020.

Bulls weighing 500 pounds and over as of January 1, 2021 totaled 2.21 million head, down 1 percent from January 1, 2020.

Calves under 500 pounds as of January 1, 2021 totaled 14.2 million head, down 1 percent from January 1, 2020.

Cattle and calves on feed for the slaughter market in the United States for all feedlots totaled 14.7 million head on January 1, 2021. The inventory is up slightly from the January 1, 2020 total of 14.7 million head. Cattle on feed in feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head accounted for 81.4 percent of the total cattle on feed on January 1, 2021, down slightly from the previous year. The combined total of calves under 500 pounds and other heifers and steers over 500 pounds (outside of feedlots) at 25.7 million head, was slightly below January 1, 2020.

Calf Crop Down 1 Percent

The 2020 calf crop in the United States was estimated at 35.1 million head, down 1 percent from the previous year's calf crop. Calves born during the first half of 2020 were estimated at 25.8 million head, down 1 percent from the first half of 2019. Calves born during the second half of 2020 were estimated at 9.39 million head, 27 percent of the total 2020 calf crop.

Compared to last Friday, Soybeans 0.55 to 0.61 higher, Wheat 0.28 to 0.29 higher, Corn 0.46 to 0.50 higher, Sorghum 0.46 to 0.47 higher.

Missouri Weekly Cattle Auction Summary 02/01/21

Receipts: 18,852 Week ago: 33,134 Year ago: 24,553

Compared to last week, feeder steers and heifers sold steady to 2.00 higher. The supply of feeders was light to moderate as weather was less than favorable for transporting livestock. Heavy rain fell early in the week, then mid-week snow fell, followed by more rains. Flash flooding was a problem in some areas, but mud is becoming a much larger problem. Wet cold mud is not the type of weather that producers want trying to keep calves looking good and gaining weight prior to marketing. Several barns in the northern part of the state canceled sales early due to the forecast of snow. Demand for feeders is moderate to good. Buyers are eagerly trying to fill orders for summer grazers before the best ones are gone and supplies get tight. Boxed beef cutouts continue to climb. Choice closed Friday at 233.95 up 11.13 and select closed at 222.70 up 9.36 compared to the previous week. Feedlot sales as of the last report on Friday afternoon totaled just under 55K head of negotiated sales, however it is likely there was more business late Friday but just how much will not be known till midmorning Monday. Sales that were reported however were much higher as feedlot managers dug in hard trying to get a little big slice of the pie. Live sales were mostly 110.00-113.00 and dressed sales were reported from mostly 174.00-178.00 with some up to 181.00. The semi-annual cattle inventory report was released late Friday afternoon. On the national level most numbers were fairly in line with estimates. The one exception was the number of beef heifers being kept for replacements which came in at 100% of the previous year which was 2% above estimates. Missouri maintained the 3^{rd} spot in the nation for beef cows that have calved but that spot in the nation for beef cows that have calved but that number was down 2% for a total of 2.035 million head. The 2020 calf crop was estimated at 1.91 million head also down 2% from the previous year. The Missouri Stocker Formula consisted of 3953 head with a weighted average weight of 549.97 lbs. with a price value of 155.73 up 4.22 compared to last Monday.
