#### CATTLE ON FEED 02/19/21 United States Cattle on Feed Up 1 Percent

**Cattle and calves on feed** for the slaughter market in the United States for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 12.1 million head on February 1, 2021. The inventory was 1 percent above February 1, 2020. This is the second highest February 1 inventory since the series began in 1996.

**Placements** in feedlots during January totaled 2.02 million head, 3 percent above 2020. Net placements were 1.96 million head. During January, placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds were 410,000 head, 600-699 pounds were 440,000 head, 700-799 pounds were 575,000 head, 800-899 pounds were 417,000 head, 900-999 pounds were 105,000 head, and 1,000 pounds and greater were 70,000 head.

**Marketings** of fed cattle during January totaled 1.82 million head, 6 percent below 2020.

**Other disappearance** totaled 56,000 head during January, 4 percent above 2020.

Cattle on Feed and Annual Size Group Estimates

**Cattle and calves on feed** for slaughter market in the United States for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head represented 81.4 percent of all cattle and calves on feed in the United States on January 1, 2021. This is comparable to the 81.6 percent on January 1, 2020.

**Marketings** of fed cattle for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head during 2020 represented 87.1 percent of total cattle marketed from all feedlots in the United States, up slightly from 87.0 percent during 2019.

### Afternoon National Slaughter Cattle Review for 02/19/21

So far for Friday in the Southern Plains negotiated cash trading has been limited on light demand. A few live purchases traded steady at 114.00 when compared to Thursday. Thus far for Friday in Nebraska and Western Cornbelt negotiated cash trading has been slow on light to moderate demand. In Nebraska live purchases traded steady to 1.00 higher at 114.00. A few dressed purchases traded at 180.00. However, not enough for a full market trend. Thursday was the last fully reported dressed market from 180.00-181.00. In the Western Cornbelt a few dressed traded at 180.00. However, not enough live or dressed purchases for a full market trend. On Thursday live purchases traded from 114.00-115.00 and dressed purchases traded from 180.00-182.00.

# Missouri Weekly Cattle Auction Summary 02/22/21

Receipts: 212 Week ago: 9691 Year ago: 35,142

No feeder sales this week for a market trend. This was the first week in at least twenty years that wasn't Christmas or New Year's week without a single reported feeder cattle auction in the state. Record breaking winter weather keep every reported action in the state dark except three special replacement cow sales held on Friday and Saturday. Boxed beef cutouts closed higher for the week. Choice closed on Friday at 239.23, up 6.86 and select at 227.90, up 6.97 compared to the previous week. Feedlot sales for the week as of the last report on Friday had volume of just over 65K head, live sales were mostly 113.00-115.00 and dressed sales mostly 180.00-182.00. Slaughter numbers were lighter this week once again due to winter weather though out the nation. The monthly cattle on feed report was published on Friday and was considered bearish as analyst missed placement numbers. On feed numbers were reported at 101.5 percent, marketings 94.3, and placements at 103.2 which was 3.5 percent above the average pre report numbers. Due to there was no feeder cattle auctions the Missouri Stocker Formula was not available.
