

WORLD AGRICULTURAL SUPPLY AND DEMAND ESTIMATES 03/09/21

WHEAT: The supply and demand outlook for 2020/21 U.S. wheat is mostly unchanged this month but there are offsetting byclass changes to exports and imports. White wheat exports are raised on continued strong sales and shipments to China and South Korea. Conversely, Hard Red Winter exports are lowered as commitments to several Western Hemisphere markets are below a year ago. The season-average farm price is unchanged at \$5.00 per bushel.

COARSE GRAINS: This month's 2020/21 U.S. corn supply and use outlook is unchanged from last month. The projected season-average farm price is unchanged at \$4.30 per bushel.

OILSEEDS: U.S. soybean supply and use projections for 2020/21 are mostly unchanged this month. With soybean crush and exports projected at 2.20 billion bushels and 2.25 billion bushels, respectively, ending stocks remain at 120 million bushels, down 405 million from last year's record. The U.S. season-average soybean price is projected at \$11.15 per bushel, unchanged from last month. Although current cash prices are significantly higher, prices received through January have averaged just over \$10.00 per bushel, reflecting forward pricing at lower prices. Soybean meal prices are also unchanged at \$400.00 per ton. The soybean oil price is forecast at 41.0 cents per pound, up 1 cent from last month.

Compared to last week, feeders sold very uneven mostly from 2.00 lower to 2.00 higher. Very little consistency could be found in any weight or class except for perhaps 600 weights that sold mostly on the steady to 2.00 higher side. Another week with supplies on the heavy supply side as volume continues to run high, even as some of the northern auctions were on an off week and didn't hold sales this week. Several farmers made use of fertilizer buggies trying to get some ground covered before rains came late week and over the weekend. Grass took on a nice shade of green as warm weather arrived. Late week, however, took a turn and temperatures cooled down winds arrived and rains fell across the state. The southern third saw extremely heavy rainfall with some areas reporting 6+ inches resulting in some standing surface water, flooding, and a return of mud. Not uncommon for this time of year, but never welcome as it can make for some sick newborn calves. On the slaughter side of the markets this week, boxed beef cutouts lost ground with choice closing Friday at 225.87 down 5.46 and select 220.27 down 0.28, compared to the previous week. Feedlot sales lost some ground as week with around 90K head of negotiated sales reported as of the Friday afternoon report. Live sales for the week were mostly from 112.00-114.00 and dressed from 178.00-180.00. According to the latest Sterling Beef Profit Tracker, feedlots are currently 25.73 on the plus side while packers are 371.85 in the black. The Missouri Stocker Formula consist of 8389 head with a weighted average weight of 553.24 lbs. and a price value of 162.16, down 0.71 compared to last week.
