

February 2021 Highlights

Total natural cheese stocks in refrigerated warehouses on February 28, 2021 were up 2 percent from the previous month and up 5 percent from February 29, 2020.

Butter stocks were up 6 percent from last month and up 17 percent

Total frozen poultry supplies on February 28, 2021 were down 3 percent from the previous month and down 14 percent from a year ago. Total stocks of chicken were down 6 percent from the previous month and down 17 percent from last year. Total pounds of turkey in freezers were up 6 percent from last month but down 6 percent from February 29, 2020.

Total frozen fruit stocks were down 8 percent from last month and down 14 percent from a year ago. **Total frozen vegetable stocks** were down 8 percent from last month but up 4 percent from a year ago.

Total red meat supplies in freezers were up 3 percent from the previous month but down 12 percent from last year. Total pounds of beef in freezers were down 2 percent from the previous month but up 3 percent from last year. Frozen pork supplies were up 7 percent from the previous month but down 24 percent from last year. Stocks of pork bellies were up 22 percent from last month but down 49 percent from last year.

Commercial red meat production for the United States totaled 4.39 billion pounds in February, down 1 percent from the 4.45 billion pounds

producêd in February 2020.

Beef production, at 2.11 billion pounds, was 1 percent below the previous year. Cattle slaughter totaled 2.52 million head, down 2 percent from February 2020. The average live weight was up 14 pounds from the previous year, at 1,390 pounds.

Veal production totaled 4.7 million pounds, 8 percent below Febru-

ary a year ago. Calf slaughter totaled 33,000 head, down 17 percent from February 2020. The average live weight was up 23 pounds from last year, at 247 pounds.

Pork production totaled 2.27 billion pounds, down 2 percent from the previous year. Hog slaughter totaled 10.4 million head, down 3 percent from February 2020. The average live weight was up 3 pounds from the previous year, at 291 pounds.

Lamb and mutton production, at 10.8 million pounds, was up slightly from February 2020. Sheep slaughter totaled 163,600 head, slightly below last year. The average live weight was 132 pounds, up 2 pounds

from February a year ago.

January to February 2021 commercial red meat production was 9.19 billion pounds, down 2 percent from 2020. Accumulated beef production was down 2 percent from last year, veal was down 19 percent, pork was down 2 percent from last year, and lamb and mutton production was down 6 percent.

Compared to last week, feeder steers and heifers sold steady to 5.00 higher. Supply was moderate as mud kept some cattle from making it to town. Demand was good, as many are optimistic both on the pasture outlook and the market. Feedlot sales for the week, as of the last report on Friday, totaled just under 99K. Live sales were reported mostly from 115.00-116.00 and dressed sales mostly at 185.00, finally breaking the long stretch of sideways movement. Box beef cutouts were stronger for the week, choice closed on Friday at 237.66, up 7.67 and select at 227.77, up 7.82. The Missouri Stocker Formula consist of 5593 head with a weighted average weight of 545.79 lbs. and a price value of 165.99, up 3.75 compared to last Monday.
