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

Compared to last week, feeder steers and heifers sold steady to 5.00 higher, with instances on a few mid-weights pushing 10.00 higher. The supply of feeders was moderate. A second week of a little better prices at the auctions resulted in a few more calves making a trip to town. Demand for feeders is moderate. Although it's almost hard to believe as of the last report planting is actually a little ahead of normal. Given that over the last several weeks only three or maybe four days have been suitable for field work it is somewhat surprising that farmers have been able to make so much progress. Many are hoping for some sunshine at this point to get crops growing and to start hay harvest. There has been some hay wrapped but for the most part hay equipment hasn't moved yet. This upcoming weekend is historically the big weekend for having to start in the state if weather allows. The monthly cattle on feed report was released on Friday, due to the covid issues last year looking only at year over year comparisons doesn't really tell much and one has to dig deeper into the actual numbers to learn anything. On feed numbers were 105 percent, placements 127 percent and marketing 133 percent. On feed and placements were about 1 percent below average estimates and marketings were even. Boxed beef cutouts have yet to find any top and keep climbing. Choice closed on Friday at 325.17, up 8.23 and select at 302.31, up 9.12 compared to the previous week. Negotiated feedlot sales for the week as of the final report on Friday totaled just under 81K head. Live sales for the week were reported mostly from 118.00-121.00 and dressed sales 188.00-191.00. MISSOURI CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION 05/17/21

There were 3.8 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending May 16, 2021. Temperatures last week averaged 54.9 degrees statewide, 8.6 degrees below normal. Precipitation averaged 0.45 inches, 0.67 inches below normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent short, 76 percent adequate, and 23 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 2 percent short, 85 percent adequate, and 13 percent surplus. Corn planted was 84 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 83 percent. Corn emerged was 60 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 64 percent. Soybeans planted was 36 percent complete, compared to the 5- year average of 29 percent. Soybeans emerged was 14 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 11 percent. Cotton planted was 65 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 54 percent. Rice planted was 88 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 78 percent. Rice emerged was 70 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 62 percent. Rice condition was rated 3 percent poor, 37 percent fair, 59 percent good, and 1 percent excellent. Winter wheat headed was 80 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 79 percent. Winter wheat condition was rated 5 percent poor, 33 percent fair, 55 percent good, and 7 percent excellent.
