

MISSOURI CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION 05/24/21

There were 1.9 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending May 23, 2021. Temperatures last week averaged 69.4 degrees statewide, 2.8 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 2.32 inches, 1.31 inches above normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 2 percent short, 56 percent adequate, and 42 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was 76 percent adequate, and 24 percent surplus. Corn planted was 90 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 88 percent. Corn emerged was 77 percent, even with the 5-year average. Corn condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 3 percent poor, 33 percent fair, 59 percent good, and 4 percent excellent. Soybeans planted was 44 percent complete, compared to the 5year average of 42 percent. Soybeans emerged was 27 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 23 percent. Cotton planted was 85 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 67 percent. Rice planted was 95 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 86 percent. Rice emerged was 85 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 74 percent. Rice condition was rated 5 percent poor, 33 percent fair, 58 percent good, and 4 percent excellent. Winter wheat headed was 91 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 90 percent. Winter wheat condition was rated 6 percent poor, 38 percent fair, 50 percent good, and 6 percent excellent.
