



Compared to last week, feeders sold steady to 4.00 lower, except for several load lots of heavier weight yearlings sold mostly in load lots which sold 2.00 to 5.00 higher. The supply of feeders was light this week as several early week auctions remained dark for the holiday. Most of the pressure this week came on the heels of the cyberattack to one of the largest processing facilities. Early uncertainty of how wild spread the effects of this would be lead to tumbling cash and futures markets early in the week. By late week though it seemed if the situation was under control and processing was getting back to normal. Grain prices also took front stage as corn jumped higher once again due to dryness both abroad and domestically. Of course some areas like most of Missouri are much to wet and need sunshine for crops so dryness isn't a nationwide issue. Farmers in the state have been trying to hay but it is proving to be difficult as we have had more than our fair share of rain. Feedlot sales for the week were light due to both the holiday and the prior mentioned disruption to processing. As of Friday afternoon negotiated trade was reported at about 65k head. Live sales were mostly 119.00-120.00 and dressed sales reported mostly from 190.00-191.00. Boxed beef cutouts continued the climb higher with choice closing on Friday at 338.98, up 8.01 and select at 311.73, up 10.83 from the previous week. MISSOURI CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION 06/01/21

There were 2.1 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending May 30, 2021. Temperatures last week averaged 65.8 degrees statewide, 1.2 degrees below normal. Precipitation averaged 1.19 inches, 0.10 inches above normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent short, 57 percent adequate, and 42 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was 1 percent short, 74 percent adequate, and 25 percent surplus. Corn planted was 92 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 91 percent. Corn emerged was 83 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 84 percent. Corn condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 30 percent fair, 59 percent good, and 3 percent excellent. Soybeans planted was 49 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 53 percent. Soybeans emerged was 38 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 35 percent. Cotton planted was 98 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 78 percent. Cotton condition was rated 7 percent poor, 25 percent fair, and 68 percent good. Rice emerged was 96 percent, compared to the 5year average of 81 percent. Rice condition was rated 5 percent poor, 30 percent fair, 53 percent good, and 12 percent excellent. Winter wheat headed was 96 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 95 percent. Winter wheat condition was rated 6 percent poor, 37 percent fair, 53 percent good, and 4 percent excellent.
