



Not to say there wasn't some quality offerings in the mix this week but nothing like the overwhelming multiple load lots of yearlings that was present in sales over the last two weeks. Because of this the extreme top highs weren't seen at every auction but when comparing equal quality the market was sure enough steady to a touch better where comparisons of like kinds could be made. The areas of the south central and southeast that had been missing out on rains much of the summer finally got a nice 1-2 inches of rain this past week. The majority of the rest of the state is still very wet with standing water still in many fields. Pastures are plentiful for this time of year and despite challenges it has not been a bad year for the cattle farmer in the state all in all. Boxed beef cutout values have continued their downward trend to more "normal" levels. Choice closed Friday at 267.94, down 10.64 and select at 251.79, down 5.62 compared to last week. Negotiated feedlot sales as of the final report Friday afternoon totaled about 74K for the week. Live sales were reported mostly from 120.00-125.00 and dressed sales mostly 196.00-202.00. MISSOURI CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION 07/05/21

4.3 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending July 11, 2021. Temperatures last week averaged 75.6 degrees statewide, 2.2 degrees below normal. Precipitation averaged 1.41 inches, 0.61 inches above normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 4 percent short, 76 percent adequate, and 20 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent very short, 4 percent short, 78 percent adequate, and 17 percent surplus. Corn silking was 39 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 63 percent. Corn dough was 2 percent, even with the 5-year average. Corn condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 30 percent fair, 53 percent good, and 8 percent excellent. Soybeans emerged was 96 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 93 percent. Soybeans blooming was 20 percent, compared to the 5year average of 30 percent. Soybeans setting pods was 4 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 6 percent. Soybeans condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 36 percent fair, 51 percent good, and 5 percent excellent. Cotton squaring was 94 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 57 percent. Cotton setting bolls was 23 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 14 percent. Cotton condition was rated 7 percent poor, 24 percent fair, and 69 percent good. Rice headed was 3 percent, compared to the 5year average of 9 percent. Rice condition was rated 3 percent poor, 28 percent fair, 51 percent good, and 18 percent excellent. Winter wheat harvested for grain was 88 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 95 percent.
