



Extreme heat was the case until late Thursday making it difficult to dangerous for cattle transport. A few auctions cancelled and others had much smaller volume that typical, even for the slower summer marketing time. Quality was also mixed with very few big drafts or load and more small packages of odds and ends. Demand was moderate and it is getting to the time of year were weaning and some kind of health program is a must and not an option unless producers are willing to give up several dollars. These discounts will continue to get more severe in the coming weeks. Boxed beef cutouts soared as choice closed on Friday at 324.83, up 28.57 and select at 298.02, up 20.93 compared to last week. Feedlot on a negotiated basis as of Friday afternoon totaled about 70K head with a live price reported mostly from 121.00-126.00, some late Friday sales up to 127.50 and dressed sales mostly 198.00-203.00 with some late sales up to 205.00. ### MISSOURI CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION 08/09/21

There were 6.0 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending August 08, 2021. Temperatures last week averaged 73.7 degrees statewide, 2.3 degrees below normal. Precipitation averaged 0.13 inches, 0.66 inches below normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent very short, 18 percent short, 79 percent adequate, and 2 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 8 percent short, 89 percent adequate, and 3 percent surplus. Corn silking was 96 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 98 percent. Corn dough was 68 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 72 percent. Corn dented was 4 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 24 percent. Corn condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 23 percent fair, 55 percent good, and 15 percent excellent. Soybeans blooming was 78 percent, even with the 5-year average. Soybeans setting pods was 48 percent, even with the 5-year average. Soybeans condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 30 percent fair, 55 percent good, and 7 percent excellent. Cotton setting bolls was 90 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 62 percent. Cotton condition was rated 11 percent poor, 33 percent fair, 55 percent good, and 1 percent excellent.
