



Compared to last week, feeder steers under 800 lbs. sold mostly 5.00 higher with some instances of 10.00 higher on those under 600 lbs., steers over 800 lbs. sold mostly steady. Feeder heifers sold steady to 5.00 higher. The supply of feeders was moderate. A few more load lots in the offering this week with over 40 full loads sold at barns around the state. Four loads of heavy eight weight steers at different locations sold from 153.50-154.75. Demand was moderate. A little moisture in some of the wheat areas might have been responsible for some of the uptick on the light weight calves, as several reporters noted the sharply higher prices seen this week. Grain harvest is still in full swing, so not a lot of farmer feeders back in the market yet. Weather swings have yet to end or level off, making verified health programs as valuable as any point in the year. Boxed beef cutouts continue to decline. Choice closed on Friday at 283.27, down 9.09 and select at 262.74, down 2.10 from last Friday. Negotiated feedlot sales as of the Friday afternoon report totaled just over 84k head with live sales mostly 122.00-124.00 and dressed sales 192.00-196.00. Monday's Missouri Stocker Formula consists of 3027 head with a weighted average weight of 544.23 lbs. and price value of 165.73, 5.86 higher than a week ago. Supply included: 79% Feeder Cattle (51% Steers, 0% Dairy Steers, 43% Heifers, 5% Bulls); 14% Slaughter Cattle (2% Steers, 0% Heifers, 87% Cows, 11% Bulls); 7% Replacement Cattle (10% Stock Cows, 62% Bred Cows, 4% Bred Heifers, 22% Cow-Calf Pairs, 2% Bulls). ### MISSOURI CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION 10/04/21

There were 5.5 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending October 3, 2021. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 7 percent very short, 34 percent short, 58 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 6 percent very short, 30 percent short, and 64 percent adequate. Corn mature was 94 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 89 percent. Corn harvested for grain was 52 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 47 percent. Corn condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 26 percent fair, 54 percent good, and 11 percent excellent. Soybeans turning color was 88 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 83 percent. Soybeans dropping leaves was 67 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 54 percent. Soybeans harvested was 11 percent complete, even with the 5-year average. Soybeans condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 28 percent fair, 55 percent good, and 8 percent excellent. Cotton condition was rated 7 percent poor, 28 percent fair, and 65 percent good. Rice harvested was 54 percent complete, compared to the 5-year average of 69 percent. Rice condition was rated 2 percent poor, 31 percent fair, 51 percent good, and 16 percent excellent. Winter wheat planted was 6 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 9 percent.
