



Compared to last week, a very light test of feeders sold with mostly steady undertones. About half the barns in the state were dark taking two full weeks off for the holidays. Auctions that did swing the gates had lighter than normal receipts which is to be expected on the holiday shortened weeks. Generally most folks know the two weeks of Christmas and New Year's isn't the best time to market livestock if you can keep from it. The monthly cattle on feed report was released last Thursday and came without any surprises being viewed as solidly neutral. Boxed beef cutouts closed on Thursday with choice at 262.94, down 0.07 and select at 252.95, up 4.67 compared to the previous week. Feedlot sales as of Thursday afternoon totaled just under 36k head. Live sales were reported from 135.00-140.00 with most sales at 135.00 and dressed sales were reported from 216.00-218.00. The Missouri Stocker Formula consist of 2330 head with a weighted average weight of 221.31 and a price value of 173.22, down 1.45 from last week.

### **MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 12/23/21**

A fairly quite week compared to the previous few around the state. Much of the southern 1/3 of the state did receive a few inches of rain late last week which was quite welcome. Temperatures have fallen to more normal levels although a fairly nice warm up is expected just in time for Christmas. Feeding continues to be minimal but stock piles of grass are quickly fading if they aren't already gone so hay feeding will only increase. Hay movement has been slow mostly sales of small qualities of small bales to equine interest as most beef farmers have plenty of round bales stacked around for feeding. The supply of hay is moderate and demand is light to moderate and prices mostly steady.
