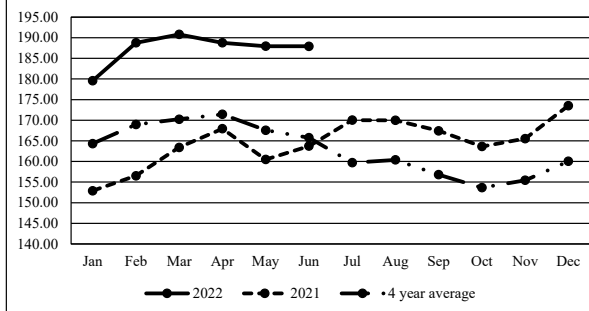

Missouri Weekly Cattle Auction Summary 07/04/22

Compared to last week, feeder steers and heifers sold 3.00 to 8.00 higher, with some local spots of 10.00 to 15.00 higher. The supply of feeders was moderate to heavy. Even though overall supplies especially for heavy weight cattle is typically at its lightest as summer progresses, there are always several producers who retain cattle to hit the market during the June/July transition and a some of those load lots came to town this week. Over the last several months, 160.00 has kind of been the bench mark to base weekly evaluations of those load lots of 8 weight steers off of. That mark was blown away this week as 231 head of 956 lb. steers sold in Joplin Regional Stockyards on Monday at 169.50. Then on Tuesday, Unionville Livestock Market sold multiple loads of heavy 8 and light 9 weights that reached solidly into the low 170.00's. As price levels continue the upward trend, many have begun to talk about the record prices from back in 2015 and debating if they are attainable again or not. For reference, the week ending June 12, 2015, recorded the weighted average price for 849 lb. steers over the entire state at 222.32. Another key factor to recall is at that same time cash corn was around 3.75 a bushel. On a much less exciting note, drought conditions are spreading across the state. Just over 61 percent of the state is highlighted on the latest drought monitor with 10 percent listed in D1 status now. Basically everything south of I-70 is now seeing the effects of extreme heat and no moisture. Several reporters made note of producers starting to cull a few cows and selling feather weight calves before they planned due strictly to lack of groceries in the field. As of the Friday afternoon report negotiated feedlot sales totaled just over 68K head. Live sales continue to see the large price gap from the north to the south. Live sales in the north this week were reported from 145.00-151.00 with dressed sales at 234.00. Live sales in the south were mostly 134.00-138.00. Boxed beef cutouts closed lower for the week. Choice closed on Friday at 263.82, down 1.16 and select closed at 240.47, down 4.55 compared to last week. The Missouri Stocker Formula for Monday consists of 6522 head with a weighted average weight of 551.38 lbs. and a price value of 191.68, 1.88 higher than a week ago. The steer/heifer spread is 25.53.

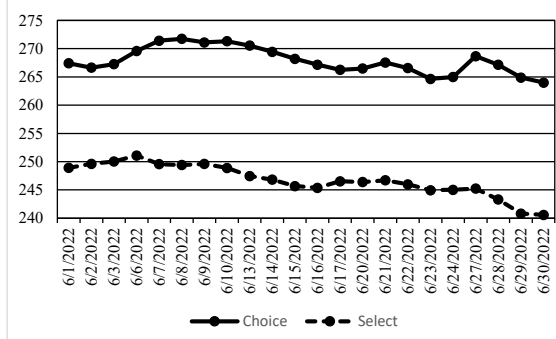

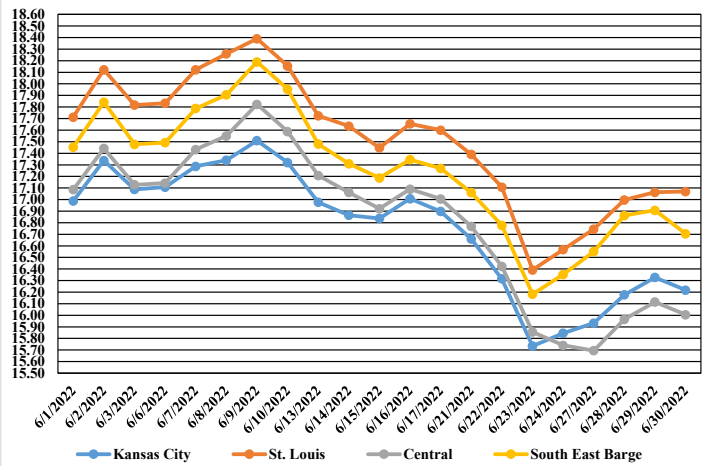

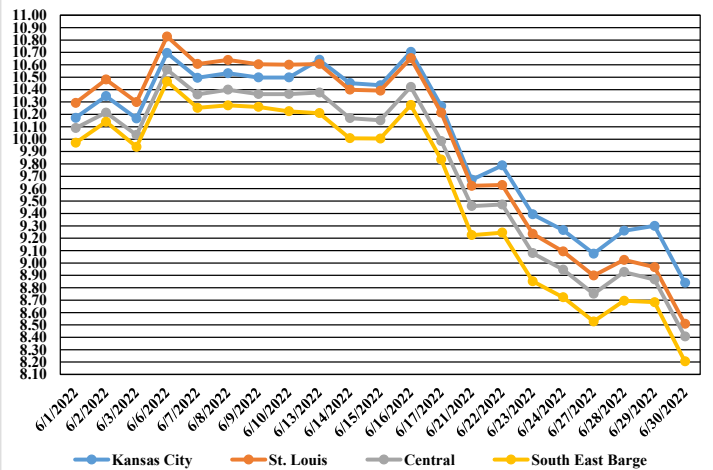

MONTHLY GRAIN CROP

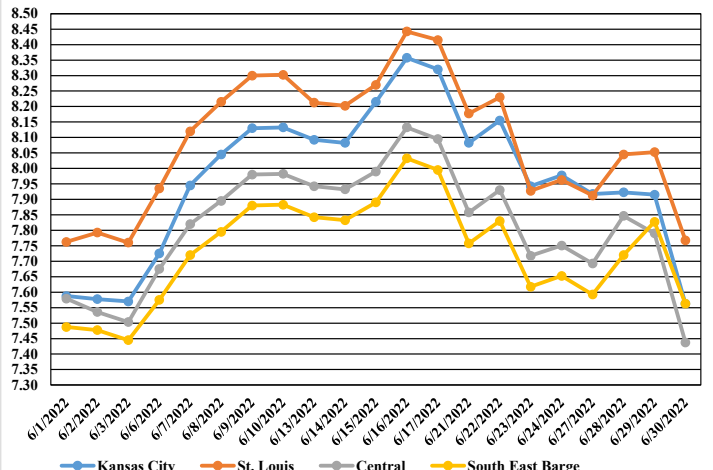
June 2022 Soybean Bids

Corn stocks in all positions on June 1, 2022 totaled 4.35 billion bushels, up 6 percent from June 1, 2021. Of the total stocks, 2.12 billion bushels are stored on farms, up 22 percent from a year earlier. Off-farm stocks, at 2.23 billion bushels, are down 6 percent from a year ago. The March - May 2022 indicated disappearance is 3.41 billion bushels, compared with 3.58 billion bushels during the same period last year.

Soybeans stored in all positions on June 1, 2022 totaled 971 million bushels, up 26 percent from June 1, 2021. On-farm stocks totaled 331 million bushels, up 51 percent from a year ago. Off-farm stocks, at 640 million bushels, are up 17 percent from a year ago. Indicated disappearance for the March - May 2022 quarter totaled 960 million bushels, up 21 percent from the same period a year earlier.

Old crop all wheat stored in all positions on June 1, 2022 totaled 660 million bushels, down 22 percent from a year ago. On-farm stocks are estimated at 93.0 million bushels, down 34 percent from last year. Off-farm stocks, at 567 million bushels, are down 19 percent from a year ago. The March - May 2022 indicated disappearance is 364 million bushels, down 22 percent from the same period a year earlier.

ACREAGE

Corn planted area for all purposes in 2022 is estimated at 89.9 million acres, down 4 percent or 3.44 million acres from last year. Compared with last year, planted acreage is expected to be down or unchanged in 35 of the 48 estimating States. Area harvested for grain, at 81.9 million acres, is down 4 percent from last year.

Soybean planted area for 2022 is estimated at 88.3 million acres, up 1 percent from last year. Compared with last year, planted acreage is up or unchanged in 24 of the 29 estimating States.

All wheat planted area for 2022 is estimated at 47.1 million acres, up 1 percent from 2021. If realized, this represents the fifth lowest all wheat planted area since records began in 1919. The 2022 winter wheat planted area, at 34.0 million acres, is up 1 percent from last year, but down 1 percent from the previous estimate. Of this total, about 23.5 million acres are Hard Red Winter, 6.86 million acres are Soft Red Winter, and 3.61 million acres are White Winter. Area expected to be planted to other spring wheat for 2022 is estimated at 11.1 million acres, down 3 percent from 2021. Of this total, about 10.4 million acres are Hard Red Spring wheat. Durum planted area for 2022 is expected to total 1.98 million acres, up 21 percent from the previous year.

MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 06/30/22

On the good side, rain free weather has allowed hay harvest to continue mostly uninterrupted. On the bad side, rain free weather has really began to show, as grass is burning and stopped growing in much of the state. Over sixty percent of the state is showing on the latest drought monitor, with near ten percent of the state moving in to D1 drought status. Nearly all of the state south of 170 is currently highlighted as abnormally or moderately dry now. Hay prices are steady to firm, supply and demand are moderate. Hay movement is moderate to good as most farmers are seeing lower yields than long term averages and are looking to buy hay now and make sure their needs are filled especially with fears that the dry weather might continue. Record high prices early in the season and a good crop had many stations saying they had more seed delivered than what they have seen for several years. Prices have dropped as we are on the down side of harvest now. Several operators parked combines once price dropped late last week. Many said they had already got their best seed and high fuel prices wasn't worth cutting more once the seed price dropped. Prices are currently 0.68 to 0.70 cents per lb.
