
Monday's Missouri Stocker Formula consists of **5095** (**6104**) head with a weighted average weight of **555.79** (**541.57**) lbs. and a price value of **188.69** (**166.27**), 5.02 lower (1.20 lower) than last Monday.

This a rolling seven day calculated weighted value which combines all Feeder Steers reported by MDA/USDA Market News Service weighing from 400-649 lbs. in the Medium and Large 1 and Medium and Large 1-2 frame and muscle classifications, including all comment cattle except Brahman X. Heifer values are in parentheses.

#### Missouri Weekly Cattle Auction Summary 07/25/22

Compared to last week, the majority of steers and heifers sold mostly steady to 4.00 lower, however there were a couple of early week sales with spots 3.00 higher. The supply of feeder was moderate with another week of large numbers of cull cows coming to the sale barns. Several market reporters noted the impact the weather had on supply and demand on cattle going to the sale barns. Last Thursday's drought monitor for Missouri showed about seventy-four percent of the state affected by some level of drought, with quite a bit more classified as D1 Moderate Drought since last week and two percent of the state in southern Missouri classified as D3 Extreme Drought. Very welcomed precipitation is in the forecast; several areas in the state received rain overnight and into Monday morning, with more expected. Friday's inventory report showed all cattle and calves down two percent at 98.8 million head. All cows and heifers that have calved was estimated at 39.8 million head, two percent less than a year ago. Of that total, beef cows were estimated at 30.4 million head and milk cows at 9.45 million head. All heifers 500 pounds and over came in at 15.6 million head. Steers 500 pounds and over were down one percent at 14.4 million head. Bulls 500 pounds and over were unchanged at 2 million head. Calves under 500 pounds totaled 27 million head, three percent less than last year. This year's calf crop is estimated at 34.6 million head, one percent less than a year ago. This month's cattle on feed report was also published on Friday. Cattle on feed on July 1 was estimated at 11.3 million head, slightly higher than a year ago. Of that total, 6.9 million were steers, one percent less than last year and 4.45 million head were heifers, three percent more than a year ago. Marketings for June totaled 2.06 million head, two percent more than a year ago. Negotiated cash sales totaled 62,400 head, as of Friday afternoon's report. Live purchases ranged from 136.00 to 147.00 and dressed from 227.00 to 230.00. **CATTLE07/22/22** All cattle and calves in the United States on July 1, 2022 totaled 98.8 million head, 2 percent below the 101 million head on July 1, 2021. All cows and heifers that have calved totaled 39.8 million head, 2 percent below the 40.6 million head on July 1, 2021. Beef cows, at 30.4 million head, down 2 percent from a year ago. Milk cows, at 9.45 million head, down 1 percent from previous year.

All heifers 500 pounds and over on July 1, 2022 totaled 15.6 million head, 2 percent below the 15.9 million head on July 1, 2021. Beef replacement heifers, at 4.15 million head, down 3 percent from a year ago. Milk replacement heifers, at 3.75 million head, down 1 percent from previous year. Other heifers, at 7.70 million head, 1 percent below a vear earlier.

Steers 500 pounds and over on July 1, 2022 totaled 14.4 million head, down 1 percent from July 1, 2021.

Bulls 500 pounds and over on July 1, 2022 totaled 2.00 million head, unchanged from previous year. Calves under 500 pounds on July 1, 2022 totaled 27.0 million head,

down 3 percent from a year earlier.

Cattle and calves on feed for the slaughter market in the United States for all feedlots totaled 13.4 million head on July 1, 2022, unchanged from previous year. Cattle on feed in feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head accounted for 84.6 percent of the total cattle on feed on July 1, 2022, up slightly from previous year. The total of calves under 500 pounds and other heifers and steers over 500 pounds (outside of feedlots), at 35.7 million head, down 3 percent from the 36.7 million head on July 1, 2021

#### **Calf Crop Down 1 Percent**

The 2022 calf crop in the United States is expected to be 34.6 million head, down 1 percent from last year. Calves born during the first half of 2022 are estimated at 25.3 million head, down 1 percent from the first half of 2021. An additional 9.30 million calves are expected to be born during the second half of 2022.

Cattle and calves on feed for the slaughter market in the United States for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 11.3 million head on July 1, 2022. The inventory was slightly above July 1, 2021. The inventory included 6.90 million steers and steer calves, down 1 percent from the previous year. This group accounted for 61 percent of the total inventory. Heifers and heifer calves accounted for 4.45 million head, up 3 percent from 2021.

Placements in feedlots during June totaled 1.63 million head, 2 percent below 2021. Net placements were 1.56 million head. During June, placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds were 360,000 head, 600-699 pounds were 270,000 head, 700-799 pounds were 370,000 head, 800-899 pounds were 369,000 head, 900-999 pounds were 175,000 head, and 1,000 pounds and greater were 85,000 ĥead.

Marketings of fed cattle during June totaled 2.06 million head, 2 percent above 2021. Other disappearance totaled 69,000 head during June, 21 percent above 2021.

MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 07/21/22 Haying is mostly finished, with some farmers wrapping up the back acres that were pushed off to a later date. Temperatures have been warm, with the sun out every day and not much moisture seen around the state. Heat and humidity have settled in until the next round of rain expected next week. Rains in any amount will be welcomed. This week's crop progress report showed ninety percent of the state's hay has been cut and just over eighty percent of the second cutting of alfalfa has been cut. The supply of hay is moderate. Hay demand and market activity is moderate. Hay prices mostly steady.
