## MISSOURI STEER (HEIFER) STOCKER FORMULA 10/09/2023

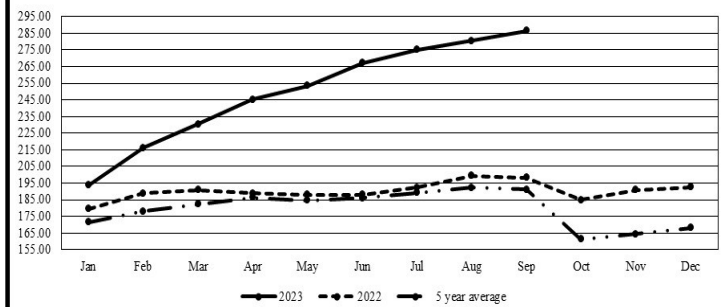
Monday's Missouri Stocker formula consists of **2828 (3341)** head with a weighted average weight of **540.53 (540.53)** lbs. and a price value of **277.24 (250.45)**, 7.00 lower (5.69 lower) than last week.

This a rolling seven day calculated weighted value which combines all Feeder Steers reported by MDA/USDA Market News Service weighing from 400-649 lbs. in the Medium and Large 1 and Medium and Large 1-2 frame and muscle classifications, including all comment cattle except Brahman X. Heifer values are in parentheses.

## MISSOURI WEEKLY CATTLE AUCTION SUMMARY

Compared to last week, feeders under 700 lbs. sold 5.00 to 10.00 lower, feeders over 700 lbs. sold mostly steady to 3.00 lower. The supply of feeders was light to moderate. Several reporters noted local offerings consisting of more average to plainer type calves with many coming right off the cow unweaned and unworked and seeing sharp discounts because of that. Demand was light to moderate and continues to be highly dependent upon heath risk. Producers investing the time and work into their cattle are still finding the market tops and being paid for the investment, although prices have backed off from some of the highs a few weeks ago, there are still impressive sales taking place when a premium product comes in the ring. There has been some talk of producers holding cattle back now waiting until weather becomes a bit more stable and some of the farmer feeders get done with harvest and come looking for winter projects. Drought conditions are still a concern in the state as of the latest report 85 percent of the state is still in drought status. Some of the southern parts of the state did receive an inch or so of rain this week but growing days are numbered now. A few of stick out sales this week included 117 head of 825 lb. steers at Windsor Livestock Auction that sold for 256.10. Tina Livestock Market sold 107 head of 723 lb. steers at 275.50. A couple of part loads of mid five weight steers sold at two different barns this week for 313.00. Boxed beef cutouts ended the week mixed. Choice closed at 302.01, up 1.23 and select closed at 275.78, down 0.26 compared to last Friday. Negotiated feedlot sales as of the Friday afternoon totaled just under 90K head for the week. Live sales were reported from 182.00-184.00 and dressed sales were reported at 288.00-290.00. Missouri Stocker Formula - Steers

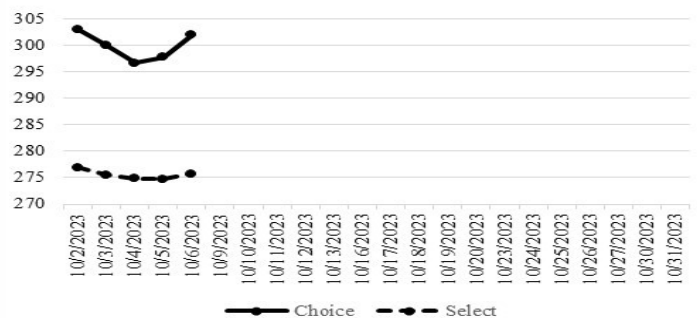

In Kansas the last reported market was on Tuesday with live FOB purchases at 182.00. In Nebraska and Western Cornbelt negotiated cash trading has been limited on light demand. In Nebraska, a few live FOB purchases traded at 184.00. However, not enough live or dressed purchases for a full market trend in either region. In Nebraska the last reported live FOB purchase market was on Thursday at 183.00. The last reported dressed delivered purchase market was on Wednesday from 288.00-290.00. In the Western Cornbelt the last reported market was Thursday with live FOB purchases from 183.00-184.00 and dressed delivered purchases, on a light test, at 290.00.

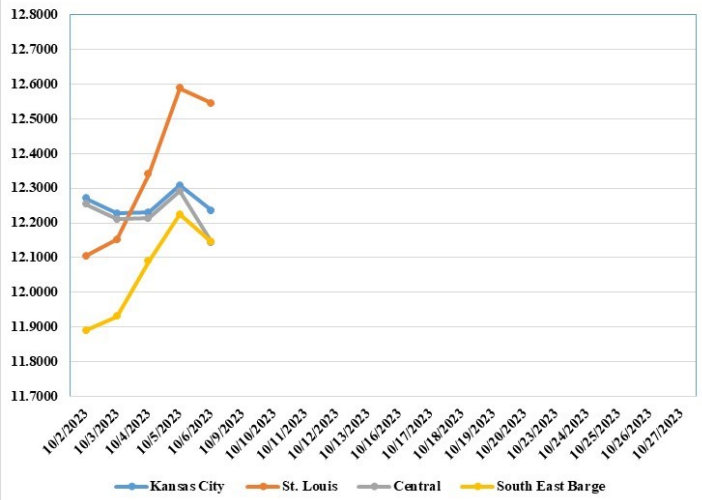

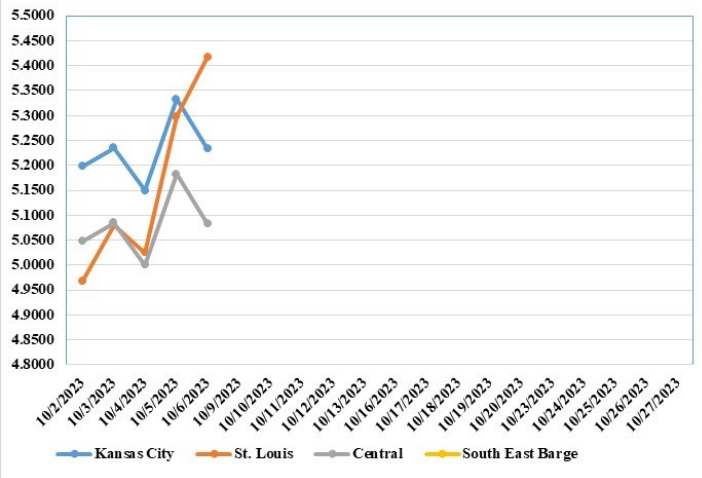

**MONTHLY GRAIN CROP**

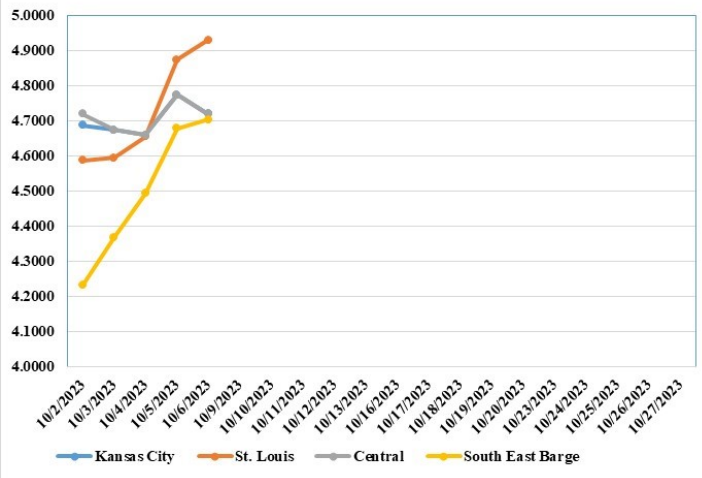
October 2023 Soybean Bids

**GRAIN CRUSHINGS AND CO=PRODUCTS & PRODUCTION**

Total corn consumed for alcohol and other uses was 490 million bushels in August 2023. Total corn consumption was down 3 percent from July 2023 but up 1 percent from August 2022. August 2023 usage included 92.3 percent for alcohol and 7.7 percent for other purposes. Corn consumed for beverage alcohol totaled 4.96 million bushels, up 2 percent from July 2023 and up 24 percent from August 2022. Corn for fuel alcohol, at 443 million bushels, was down 3 percent from July 2023 but up 3 percent from August 2022. Corn consumed in August 2023 for dry milling fuel production and wet milling fuel production was 91.9 percent and 8.1 percent, respectively. **Dry mill co-product production** of distillers dried grains with solubles (DDGS) was 1.78 million tons during August 2023, down slightly from July 2023 and down 5 percent from August 2022. Distillers wet grains (DWG) 65 percent or more moisture was 1.30 million tons in August 2023, down 1 percent from July 2023 and down 2 percent from August 2022. **Wet mill corn gluten feed production** was 257,948 tons during August 2023, down 7 percent from July 2023 but up 4 percent from August 2022. Wet corn gluten feed 40 to 60 percent moisture was 207,397 tons in August 2023, down 8 percent from July 2023 but up 10 percent from August 2022.

**FATS AND OILS: OILSEED CRUSH, PROD. CONSUMPTION**

Soybeans crushed for crude oil was 5.07 million tons (169 million bushels) in August 2023, compared with 5.55 million tons (185 million bushels) in July 2023 and 5.25 million tons (175 million bushels) in August 2022. Crude oil produced was 2.01 billion pounds, down 8 percent from July 2023 and down 4 percent from August 2022. Soybean once refined oil production at 1.71 billion pounds during August 2023 decreased 2 percent from July 2023 and decreased 2 percent from August 2022. Canola seeds crushed for crude oil was 190,420 tons in August 2023, compared with 209,247 tons in July 2023 and 171,334 tons in August 2022. Canola crude oil produced was 154 million pounds, down 6 percent from July 2023 but up 13 percent from August 2022. Canola once refined oil production, at 155 million pounds during August 2023, was down 7 percent from July 2023 but up 15 percent from August 2022. Cottonseed once refined oil production, at 29.4 million pounds during August 2023, was up 14 percent from July 2023 but down 38 percent from August 2022. Edible tallow production was 85.8 million pounds during August 2023, down 4 percent from July 2023 and down 16 percent from August 2022. Inedible tallow production was 313 million pounds during August 2023, up 11 percent from July 2023 but down 11 percent from August 2022. Technical tallow production was 109 million pounds during August 2023, up 22 percent from July 2023 but down 3 percent from August 2022. Choice white grease production, at 127 million pounds during August 2023, increased 36 percent from July 2023 and increased 10 percent from August 2022
