


Compared to last week, feeders sold unevenly steady from 2.00 lower to 2.00 higher. The supply of feeders was moderate. Many reporters have noted the change in the make-up of the feeder supply over the last two or three weeks. A much larger percentage of the offering now changing to short or non-weaned new crop calves carrying a bit more flesh and not providing that immediate gain for new owners. Demand remains good although prices are at lower levels. Spring planting is running at full force and a ton of progress has been made over the last two weeks. Moisture is still very much a concern, although it has been nice for field work being this dry in April is not a good way to start the year. There was even some having that took place last week most of which will be wrapped but there was at least a little dry alfalfa put up now. The monthly Cattle on Feed report was released on Friday afternoon and should be viewed as neutral to slightly positive placements were reported 12% below last year and slightly below the pre-report estimates. On Feed numbers was reported as 1% above last year and at the bottom of the pre-report range of estimates. Marketing were reported 14% below year ago levels but again right at the bottom of pre-report estimates. A few notable sales this week included a part load of 459 lb. steers at Callaway Livestock Center that sold at 372.00. A load of 707 lb. steers at Lolli Brothers Livestock Market sold for 279.75. Callaway Livestock Center sold a full load of 848 lb. steers for 271.75. Ozarks Regional Stockyards sold a part load of 545 lb. heifers for 293.00 and New Cambria Livestock Auction had a load of 701 lb., heifers which brought 259.50. Boxed beef cutouts values were lower for the week. Choice closed on Friday at 295.67, down 4.90 and select closed at 290.83, down 4.91 compared to last week. Negotiated feedlot sales as of the Friday afternoon report totaled about 49K head price levels were steady to slightly lower this week. Live sales were reported at 182.00-184.00 and Dressed sales at 292.00. 





MISSOURI CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION 04/15/24

There were 6.1 days suitable for fieldwork in the week ending April 14, 2024. Statewide, the average temperature was 59.4 degrees, 6.1 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 0.49 inches, 0.62 inches below normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 9 percent very short, 25 percent short, and 66 percent adequate. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 14 percent very short, 34 percent short, and 52 percent adequate. Corn planted reached 26 percent, compared to the 5year average of 10 percent. Corn emerged reached 1 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 1 percent. Soybeans planted reached 8 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 1 percent. Cotton planted reached 2 percent. Rice planted reached 35 percent, compared to the 5 -year average of 12 percent. Winter wheat headed reached 5 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 1 percent. Winter wheat condition was 1 percent very poor, 1 percent poor, 23 percent fair, 64 percent good, and 11 percent excellent.

CATTLE ON FEED

Cattle and calves on feed for the slaughter market in the United States for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 11.8 million head on April 1, 2024. The inventory was 1 percent above April 1, 2023. The inventory included 7.27 million steers and steer calves, up 2 percent from the previous year. This group accounted for 61 percent of the total inventory. Heifers and heifer calves accounted for 4.56 million head, up 1 percent from 2023.

Placements in feedlots during March totaled 1.75 million head, 12 percent below 2023. Net placements were 1.69 million head. During March, placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds were 330,000 head, 600-699 pounds were 260,000 head, 700-799 pounds were 460,000 head, 800-899 pounds were 466,000 head, 900-999 pounds were 170,000 head, and 1,000 pounds and greater were 60.000 head.

Marketings of fed cattle during March totaled 1.71 million head, 14 percent below 2023.

Other disappearance totaled 57,000 head during March, 8 percent above 2023.

MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 04/18/24

Hay season is underway in the state, granted we aren't talking dry hay yet but, there has been several producers out baling and wrapping. Planting progress is well underway and currently well ahead of the five-year average pace. Drought conditions persist and although the lack of moisture is allowing farmers to get work done moisture is needed near 70 percent of the state is currently showing on the drought monitor. That compares to only 14 percent a year ago at this time. There have been several reports of producers out buying some hay now to store till next feeding season as they do not wish to start the year with empty hay piles now knowing how last year went. The supply of hay is light to moder-ate, and prices are mostly steady.
